
BRIEF HISTORY OF BENJAMIN POLLOCK'S TOYSHOP

From its early days in east London's Hoxton, Benjamin Pollock printed and supplied theatrical sheets costing 'a penny plain and twopence coloured' to his varied clientele including local children aspiring to the stage, city gents nostalgic for their childhood and well-known actors from the larger stage such as Charlie Chaplin.

Moving to Covent Garden around the time of WWII, the legacy of Mr Pollock encouraged local artists, actors and performers to collaborate on creating theatres and performances. Still popular in the vibrant 60s London scene. Pollock's

toyshop became a focus for artists, designers and musicians under the new ownership of Marguerite Fawdry. One of the original shops to open in the renovated Covent Garden Market, it was sold to Coronation Street actor and toy theatre historian, Peter Baldwin.

After Peter's death in 2015, the team that worked with him took over, continuing the Pollock's story to work with some of the UK's top illustrators to create our unique range of toys and games.





